

# 3. Read about the Pyrenees Mountains then answer the questions.

The Pyrenees mountain range is incredibly long, about 430 kms. It divides France and Spain with, of course little Andorra is in the middle! The form of the mountains was made by glaciers which have waterfalls beside them that make four rivers that go into the valleys on the Spanish side.

In the Pyrenees you can find a beautiful national park called The Odesa National Park. Inside the park there are all kinds of wildlife, 32 different species of mammals, for example, the lbex, foxes or otters; over a 100 different kinds of birds such as vultures or golden eagles, 8 varieties of reptiles, several different kinds of fish, six amphibians and an incredible 139 species of butterfly!

Many of the species of fauna are on red or endangered species lists such as the Pyrenean Ibex goat.

There are lots of farmers too who live and work there, they usually have cattle, sheep and horses. Don't try counting how many sheep or cows you can see because the famers say they have about 7,000 on the mountains!!!! It's one of the ways the inhabitants of the mountain make enough money to live.

Lots of tourists visit the park too, especially in winter when there is a lot of snow and they can go skiing or snow boarding. If you don't want to climb a big mountain like Monte Perdido (in English that means The Lost Mountain) you can go walking, have a group trek with your friends or go rafting if you like water! Apart from the natural attractions, visitors have access to the Eco Museum, Romanesque Chapels, and ancient churches.

In 1997 Mount Perdido, as part of the national park site, was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. According to UNESCO, Mount Perdido has a classic geological formation with deep canyons and "spectacular cirque walls". The landscape is also a beautiful scene with meadows, lakes, caves, forests and mountain slopes. Science has also invested in the area with a large number of conservation projects in place to ensure the sustainability of the park for generations to come. So if you want to see natural beauty combined with learning how farmers and animals live in mountainous regions this is the place to go!
